Communication, Language and Literacy

Main texts:

Skills:

- Maintain attention, and concentrate for a small period of time.
- Respond to instructions in a two part sequence.
- Use language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in play situations.
- Use talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.
- To continue a rhyming string and take part in rhyming activities.
- To link sounds to letters, and begin to segment the sounds and blend them together.

- To write their own first name.
- To make marks and give meaning to them.
- To begin learning phase 2 Letters and Sounds (e.g. letter sounds s, a, t etc.)

- Create representations for numbers 1-6.
- Recognise the numerals 1-6.

Physical Development

- To travel with confidence around, over, under and through balancing and climbing equipment.
- To experiment with different ways of moving.
- To use simple tools to change materials.
- To begin to use anticlockwise movement with a dominant hand.
- To develop healthy and hygienic routines.
- To show understanding of the need for safety.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Jobs and responsibilities in our class
- To talk about what we like and what we think.
- To be confident when making new friends.
- To describe how we feel and why we feel that way.
- To share with other children.
