# Safeguarding corner Online gaming—Fortnite

Fortnite is an online survival game where players fight against each other in player versus play combat to be the last one standing. Players can use a multitude of weaponry including rifles, handguns and rocket launchers to eliminate other players. New versions of the game also feature multiple modes which offer something different.

Within Fortnite players can communicate with multiple players which opens children to a number of potential risks, including exposure to inappropriate language, content, scams and grooming. Fortnite has a PEGI 12 age rating, but we are aware that children much younger than 12 are accessing this and other games.
