News from The Executive Head's Desk

Highlight of the week for me was definitely the opening of our new Key Stage Two building on Monday morning. It looks amazing and everyone is super excited to have this new space to work in. A huge thank you to Ashe Construction who have worked so well to get it ready and hand it over to us far earlier than we were expecting. An early Christmas present for us all. Thank you also to Warwickshire County Council who have worked closely with us to ensure the build is fit for purpose. On Monday Philip Hamilton the CEO of our trust cut the ribbon to the doors of the new building and all of the children cheered and clapped the builders. It was a wonderful occasion.

Year 5 were the first class to move in yesterday and when I walked down the corridor to see them I thought at first they had forgotten to come to the building it was so quiet. They were all in their classroom working hard and focussed on their maths and loving their new space. We all laughed though when we looked at the classroom windows! Year 2 had their noses pressed up against them as they couldn't believe their eyes that children were finally in the new building.

Years 3 and 4 moved in today and what was once a quiet serene space is now full of the buzz of learning. The corridors are starting to be developed as learning spaces with reading hubs and group work areas. We are starting to think about the artwork for the walls and planning the development of outdoor areas for each pair of year groups. So many exciting things to look forward. It will be at least 5 years though before the school is full. By 2025 our current year one classes will be in year six and this is when Heathcote will be at capacity.

I will say though it is a long way from Hedgehogs (Reception children) up one corridor, through the centre offices and then down the other corridor to get to Cherry class (Year 5). I jokingly said I think I might need to get a scooter to move around on or a Segway. I will certainly get my steps in each day. We really are hoping that at the end of Spring we will be able to have another official opening with all of the parents, grandparents and children so that everyone can see and experience Heathcote in all its glory. 
