Spotlight on History

This half term Year 1 have been learning all about The Great Fire of London. We delved into the past using Samuel Pepy's diary to guide us along the journey of the fire. They sequenced events to form timeline of the fire, leading up to the children writing independent diaries.

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To help the children, visualise London in 1666 they created thier own houses to represent how London looked in this era. The children carefully planned their design thinking about key features of houses built at this time. They then selected suitable materials such as cardboard and tissue paper and worked as a team to create a house as close to their plans as possible.
