Reading - On the Origin of the Species By Sabina Radeva.

What Mr Darwin Saw by Mick Manning. Speaking and Listening: Discussions about issues raised in our class novel and the video. Hotseating characters from the story. Discussion about peoples' thoughts, feelings and perspectives about the characters. Acting out 'Road's End' and adding in own speech.

Writing Composition - Writing for different purposes, developing stamina, editing and improving work throughout.

Narrative: Writing a narrative text based upon a video called 'Road's End'.

Nonfiction: Completing discussion texts highlighting the benefits and drawbacks of evacuation

Poetry: Utilising simile, metaphor and vocabulary choices to convey atmosphere and feelings.

Spelling: Weekly spelling lesson on the following patterns: Word families (gram) based on common words, showing how words are related in form and meaning. Words that can be nouns and verbs. Words with a long /o/ sound spelt 'ou' or 'ow'. Words ending in -ible.

Grammar:. Preparation for SATs papers- revision of a variety of topics. Understanding past and present tenses (Perfect, Simple and Progressive).

Handwriting: Weekly practise based on spelling patterns. Emphasis on neat presentation and pride in all written

Religious Education

Key Question: What matters most to Christians and Humanists? Express their own ideas about some big moral concepts, such as fairness or honesty comparing them with the ideas of others they have studied. Describe some Humanist values simply. Measurement: Perimeter, Area and Volume


Text Adventures
