You're invited to talke part as...



Roman soldiers

Ask your soldier(s) to start in the middle of a shot facing away from the camera, as if listening to orders. Then ask them to stand to attention, turn smartly (left, right, or to face the camera) and then march out of camera shot.

Please feel free to do a separate take in each direction so we can give the impression of lots of soldiers. The Roman Empire was pretty big.



Shepherds

- 1. Please video the shepherds in the dark, ideally outside, sitting on the ground. Shine a bright light above their heads. Shepherds can either scramble to their feet or fall to their knees, looking frightened. Hold final position for 3 seconds. Feel free to do several takes, in different positions.
- 2. Then, separately, video the shepherds running in slow motion from left to right outside, towards bright torchlight coming from above them on the right.



Angels

Please video 10 seconds of your angel(s) standing outside in the dark, and a spotlight (bright torch or phone light) lighting them from the front.

Show angels lifting and spreading out their arms like wings, looking happy, and singing or saying 'Alleluia' or 'Gloria'.



Sheep and lambs

Mime eating grass, with occasional "baaa-aaa". Lambs could frisk around a bit, with a high pitched "baaaair".



Camels

Please video the camels in the dark, walking slowly, in a lumbering, camel-like fashion, from the right towards a bright torchlight (torch off camera) shining from above on the left.



Donkeys

Looking in a bored manner to the left, then changing to the right, and maybe an "Ee-aw".

Cows

Chewing and mooing.

Other stable animals

With appropriate actions.
