#### News from The Executive Head's Desk

Well what a range of weather we have had this week; lashings of rain, wind and then peppered with blue skies and sunshine. Difficult to know what to expect from hour to hour at the minute but it doesn't stop our children at Heathcote Primary from enjoying themselves. This term Onside Coaching have joined us to develop PE further and I watched the children improving their football skills outside in the playground whilst the rain pattered down. The smiles on the children's faces didn't diminish as they kicked that ball around. Mrs Everett took year 4 out on to the playground to play a times tables game in between showers on Thursday and again it was great to see how much fun they had learning to recall multiplication facts outside. It is important to get out and about as much as possible it is good for mental health and wellbeing. Especially at this time of year with dark mornings and the sun setting early.

I do hope next time you are visiting school you get to see some of the fabulous displays around school. One of the children's favourites is our new Exciting Writing display. Last term Miss Cowcher launched new 'Exciting Writing' books where each term the whole school will follow a theme and write. These books will stay with them throughout their entire time at Heathcote and hopefully by the time the children get to Year 6 they will have a whole range of different writing they can be proud of. Our new display showcases writing from Reception to Year 4 and I was stood with guite a few of the children who were admiring the great range. It was lovely to hear Eloise in Squirrels say 'Look at Reception writing it is good isn't it?' The children are proud of each other's achievements. This demonstrates our one school rule of 'Respect.' We also have a new interactive maths investigation area and again children are stopping and trying out their maths skills and using knowledge to solve problems. Up in Science corner there is a great range of magnets where we are teaching physics and the properties of magnetism. I particularly love a new display in year 4 where they combine Geography, Science and Maths as they learn about mountains. Ask to take a look at it. It is fascinating. In fact there is a great range of Geography around school at the minute. Year One are learning about London and have explored maps of Great Britain, Year Three are learning about the journey of chocolate and studies maps of the world to plot where the cacoa bean comes from. In Year Two they are being Street Detectives and studying local maps to understand how our community has developed. Down in Reception they are going to the different worlds of Traditional Tales and looking at where castles might spring up and why. I also enjoyed a bit of dough disco with Hedgehogs when we sang Incy Wincy Spider.

Mrs Abernethy launched our new language of the month on Monday with Mandarin. The children all use some Makaton when greeting each other and it is great to see this embedded in the school and now we are adding Mandarin to our knowledge. Ni Hao is Hello Dàjiā, zǎo ān is Good Morning Everyone. Come and see our language display to learn more or of course ask the children to teach you. The staff are currently planning and developing our curriculum further and are focussing on the different subjects. We have been talking about Modern Foreign Languages and what we will teach the children here at Heath-cote. In Reception and KS1 they are taught basics in lots of different languages, French, Spanish, German etc but at KS2 it is a statutory requirement and we want to make sure we teach a language that will develop this subject thoroughly. Spanish is being taught in year 3 and 4 currently but it may be as we increase expertise in the staff this language will change.

This week we have had a safeguarding audit. This is an annual visit from Community Academies Trust to monitor our safeguarding and also our curriculum on personal development. The children were extremely positive about how they are supported in the school and know who they should seek out to help them keep safe. They couldn't stop sharing everything we get up to here. We are proud of personal development at Heathcote Primary. We want the children to be ready for employment one day and be a part of our ever-growing community. So we are creating lots of experiences for them such as Mad Science workshops to inspire scientists or live musical performances like Palinsander Recorders to inspire musicians. Staff demonstrated that they receive rigorous training in safeguarding and were able to talk confidently about 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' and how they follow clear procedures for Child Protection.

We have lots of things coming up this term. So please watch out on the communication board and visit our website and read the newsletters. The children are going on various visits, our Willow Dome will soon be built in the forest are, we are currently entering a competition to create the best portrait of Shake-speare, Pancake Day is coming, start practising flipping and The Friends of Heathcote have some fabulous events for 2020 planned starting with a Race Night. Keep fingers crossed as well that you will definitely see our new building rise from the mud.


