#### News from the Deputy Head

What a wet, soggy end to the week! I'm not sure about you, but I was worried I might need to swim to school! Hopefully it will dry up over the weekend.

With all the different activities we've done this week, the focus has been on considering others. We started the week with a Remembrance Day assembly and created a poppy display in school. The children showed great compassion for those who have served



and fought in wars and enjoyed sharing stories about their great grandparents. Butterflies and Foxes created poppy wreaths, Hedgehogs drew pictures of poppies and Otters made clay poppies to put around the school. Owls collaborated in making a poppy collage inspired by Andy Warhol's pop art, they also wrote letters to soldiers thanking them for their bravery and Squirrels

looked at how we remember fallen soldiers by creating poignant crosses.

On Tuesday we launched our new Language of the Month and decided as a school to learn Makaton. Makaton is a type of sign language that is used with speech to help communicate understanding. As I walk around school, the children are enthusiastically greeting me and asking how I am using the signs they have learnt. This week also marked Anti-Bullying week with the theme -Change starts with Us. Across the school, the children have been looking at how we can make positive changes or help others to make changes for the better. All these ideas have been recorded and decorated on heart templates which will be hanging around school for all to see shortly.

Like the Children in Need vision, it is important to us that all children have a childhood that is safe, happy, secure and allows them the chance to reach their full potential.

On top of all of this, we have been busy in other areas too! 
