English

Our core texts this half term are, Secret Sky Garden Linda Sarah and There is a Map on my Lap- Dr Sues.

Speaking and listening (with links to reading)

Listen to, discuss and express views about books at a level beyond that which they can read independently.

Discuss the significance of the title and events. Link what they hear or read to own experiences. Explain understanding of what is read.

Discuss the sequence of events in books and how items of information are related.

Discuss favourite words and phrases. Answer and ask questions.

Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read.

Draw inferences on the basis of what is being said and done.

Reading and Phonics

Floppy's Phonics -Daily Phonics we shall be recapping constants blends by beginning at Level 4.

Reading to be blended in with English lesson, CP and Phonic session 2.

Learning to read by sight the Year 1 common exception words.

Introducing Predicting Pip - The reading skill of prediction.

Writing

Develop a sentence orally ready for writing. Writing simple sentences containing full stop and capital letters.

Write for different purposes including about fictional personal experiences, poetry, non-fiction and real events.

Read writing aloud with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear.

Begin to include an adjective within their writing.

Religious Education

Big Question:

Who is a Christian and what do they believe?

Emerging:

□ Talk about the fact that Christians believe in God and follow the example of Jesus (A1).

Recognise some Christian symbols and images used to express ideas about God (A3).

Expected:

□ Talk about some simple ideas about Christian beliefs about God and Jesus (A1). □ Re-tell a story that shows what Christians might think about God, in words, drama and pictures, suggesting what it means (A2).

□ Talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong arising from the stories (C3).
□ Ask some questions about believing in God and offer some ideas of their own (C1).
